I'm recalling a devotion read to a group of teachers once. It was about a coach who was teaching a PE class, and he was testing the class to see how well they could catch a football. When one young man missed all three passes, the coach said, "Go to the locker room. You'll never amount to anything!" The coach probably meant, "You'll never make a football player," but the young man translated it as, "You'll never amount to ANY-THING!" It's not only teachers who say things to children that are interpreted rightly or wrongly, it al can also be parents of friends.

You've probably heard the phrase, "It takes a village to raise a child." As we think of Martin Luther Academy, we like to think of our school as a family.
